## Study and Learn

Everytime Aling Berta goes to the market, she always buy the needs of her family at the "talipapa" or in the "Palengke ng Bayan". She finds out that the food stuff in the "talipapa" are much lower than the mall or wet market in big department stores. She is conscious of the amount that she can save every market day. Usually she buys 5 kilos of NFA rice at P27.50 per kilo that amounts to $\boldsymbol{P} 137.50$; 3 kinds of leafy vegetables at $\mathcal{P} 7.25$ per "tali" amounting to $\mathbf{F}^{\text {2 }} 21.75$; galunggong at $\boldsymbol{P} 75.00$ per kilo and buto-buto at $\mathcal{P} 65.00$ per kilo. She does not forget to buy salt at P5.00 per "supot", brown sugar at P26.00 a kilo. Although this outlook of Aling Berta does not make her family richer, her family budget could afford to save a little for emergency purpose. What kind of mother is Aling Berta?

What were the expenses of Aling Berta?

1. Rice - One hundred thirty-seven pesos and fifty centavos
2. Vegetables - Twenty-one pesos and seventy-five centavos - 3 "tali" at seven pesos and twenty-five centavos each
3. Fish - Seventy-five pesos
4. Buto-buto - Sixty-five pesos
5. Salt - Five pesos
6. Sugar - Twenty-six pesos

You may express or write money either in figures or in word form. The decimal point is read as "and". The pesos and centavos are separated by a decimal point.
