

The words this, that, these and those often appear in the stories. They are demonstrative pronouns. They point out a particular person, place or thing.

This (for some things near you) Example:




This is my paper.

# That (for some things far from you) Example:




These and those are used to point out and identify plural nouns.

Those are my friends from fourth grade.

Demonstrative pronouns point out a particular person, place, or thing. Demonstrative pronouns are this, that, these and those.

This and these point out nouns that are near the person speaking.

That and those point out things that are far from the person speaking.


This and that are singular. These and those are plural.




