What Is This Module About?

The family is considered to be the basic unit of society. It is the source of emotional, physical, spiritual and financial support of an individual.

It is important to study why a family is essential to the development of an individual. This module aims to stress the importance of family to learners in a simple and fun way.

Another point that this module will focus on is the importance of the roles of each family members. It points out how the roles of family members can shape a family as a whole.

As an overview, this module aims to show the importance of family and the roles and duties of each member in relation to self-development.

This module is divided into two lessons:

Lesson 1 – My Family and I

Lesson 2 – *The Roles of Family Members*

The first lesson discusses the meaning of a family and the importance of "being a member" of a family. It also discusses the importance of special events that keeps the family together. The second lesson focuses on the roles - and its importance - that each family member has to do.



Take a look at the family on the left. It is composed of a father, a mother, and two children. Not all families are the same. Some families have grandparents living with them like the picture on the right.






Some families have a lot of children.

A family is there to love and care for you.






A family is very important. Do you want to know why? Take a look at this fruit. It is sweet and tasty. It is also very nutritious. But where did this fruit come from?





Love keeps this family happy. They take care of one another. They listen to each other's problems and dreams. Whenever there are problems, they pray together.



Boyet's father is always drinking with his friends. Boyet feels lonely because his father has no time for him. So, Boyet does not study his lessons and just play all day.


Now you see how important families are. If a child comes from a happy family, that child will grow up to be secure and responsible. We must have love and care in our families.



"Yes," said Ana. "But that is not the reason why I am happy."


Julie was confused. How could games and food not be the reason? So she decided to ask Ana some more questions.

"There's another reason why I am so happy!"


Ana exclaimed.

"Why? Doesn't Maan live with you anymore?" Julie asked.






"Maan studies in the city. She lives with my Aunt. But since it's Papa's birthday, she will be going home to be with us!" Ana explained.




In a family, everyone has a role. Everyone must do something for the benefit of the family. Look at the following pictures.



Another role of parents is to provide their children with education. Children must be able to go to school and learn different things.


Parents should also teach their children to respect the community and the nation. They should teach their children to obey laws.

Children must also study well. They must not waste the education given to them.




Children must also help their parents. They should help in household chores. This is another way of showing respect and love.



Children must be respectful towards their parents. It is their duty to respect, love and obey their parents.








Some children do not go to school. Other children go to school but do not study their lessons. It is the role of children to study well. This is a gift that they can give to their parents.

Some parents do not show their love for one another. As husband and wife, they must love and respect each other. Other parents fight and get angry all the time. This makes the home an unhappy one.






